CEJA Presidium and working group - registration open!



The CEJA Presidium and working group will take place in Brussels on 27 and 28

May. Here is the draft agenda. Make sure you register before 20 May.

Only **two representatives from each member organisation can attend the Presidium**, a third representative may be accepted subject to the prior agreement of the Presidency (in this case, a written request must be sent to the Presidency at least one week before the meeting).

National organisations must **select a head of delegation**, preferably a farmer (see Article 8.2 of CEJA's <u>Internal Regulations</u>).

Comparative study - call for participants!



<u>Euromontana</u> is conducting a comparative study on the **sustainable** management of mountain grasslands across Europe.

They are collecting **good practices to sustainably manage mountain grasslands** considering current economic social and environmental issues (e.g.

depopulation, changes in land use and climate change). For instance, they have been looking into pastoral schools, conservation of mountain pastures, tourism diversification, etc.

What's happening in the EU?

Young farmers to get better access to credit thanks to new initiative



29 April: The European Investment Bank (EIB) and the European Commission's DG AGRI launched a joint initiative for improving access to funding for young farmers in the EU this week. The related conference saw speakers including Commissioner Hogan and EIB Vice President Andrew McDowell take the stage, alongside CEJA President Jannes Maes. CEJA's press release about the joint initiative is available here.

The joint initiative makes available a €1 billion loan package composed of €700 million for small and medium enterprises in the agricultural and bio-economy value chains, of which a minimum of 10% will be allocated to young farmers, and two pilot loans worth €275 million targeted at young farmers and climate change mitigation.

is channelled **through specialised financial intermediaries like commercial banks, national/regional promotional banks** with the objective to create leverage for additional funding.

Provided with the EIB's resources, not only do the intermediaries commit themselves to deliver lower interest rates and longer maturities; they also commit themselves to finance a similar portfolio of SMEs for at least twice the amount of the EIB loan. Also, the € 1 billion loans from the EIB is expected to create leverage of at least an additional € 1 billion.

The results of a fi-compass <u>survey</u> on financial needs and access to finance of EU agricultural enterprises were also presented at the launch, revealing that **27% of young farmers' requests of loans were rejected in 2017.** A <u>report</u> on using **financial instruments to reduce the impact of price volatility** in agriculture was also discussed.

Following the conference, Commissioner Hogan visited farms in the Netherlands and in Flanders to promote the initiative.

Commission launches "One-Hectare Initiative"




25-26 April: Commissioner for Agriculture and Rural Development **Phil Hogan announced the "One-Hectare Initiative"** during the "Our Forests, Our Future" conference in Brussels. The initiative will give the option to the Member States to include in their CAP Strategic Plans the possibility to **compensate farmers if they plant forest on one hectare of their land.**

The idea is to give a **lump-sum payment per year during the next CAP through the rural development programmes** to help Member States **achieve climate and biodiversity objectives**.

Forests cover 43% of EU territory and the forest sector provides more than 3.5

Calls & Opportunities



- Feedback on an EU Commission <u>roadmap</u> for **EU quality schemes** can be submitted **until 27 May**.
- <u>Calls for proposal</u> for the **LIFE programme** which is the EU's funding instrument for the **environment and climate action**, have been launched, with the **deadline for concept notes on 17 June 2019**.
- Two new consultations have been published related to EU state aid: an evaluation of state aid instruments and a review of agricultural state aid guidelines. The deadline for feedback is 19 July.


