CEJA's General Assembly will take place at Hamra Farm, just outside of **Stockholm, Sweden**, on **27-29 June**. Many thanks to all those of you who registered, we look forward to seeing you there!



#### **CEJA engagements this week**

The CEJA Presidency and Secretariat participated in a number of conferences and events around the EU this week. CEJA President Jannes Maes spoke at an event in Warsaw on the **role of cooperatives in empowering farmers**. CEJA Vice President Tomáš Ignác Fénix participated at a **Joint Research Centre workshop on the farmers of the future** in Brussels. CEJA Secretary General Alessia Musumarra presented the organisation to a group of visiting young farmers from Croatia. To end the week, Jannes attended the **Third African Union-EU miniterial conference at the FAO's headquarters** in Rome.

#### **AGRIFISH Council summary**



**18 June:** The last AGRIFISH Council under the Romanian Presidency focused on the **post-2020 CAP reform package**, among other subjects.

The Romanian Presidency presented their <u>progress report</u> carried out on all the Commission proposals, but **the Council didn't reach a partial general approach.** 

The majority of delegations welcomed the report thanking the Romanian Presidency for the hard work considering the report a good basis to continue the work under the incoming Finnish presidency, but it became clear that further **discussions regarding implementation and reporting of the CAP Strategic Plans and the green architecture must be had** before reaching an agreement.

The Spanish delegation also presented the outcome of the CAP Green Architecture post-2020 Congress **"Digging deeper into EcoSchemes"**, that took place in Zafra (Spain) on 29-31 May. The event was welcomed by the other delegations as a very good opportunity to debate the **environmental and climate change challenges** faced by European agriculture, with a specific focus on the reality of southern Europe.

EU heads of state also met at a summit in Brussels on 20-21 June to discuss the <u>EU's</u> <u>strategic agenda for 2019-24</u>. Leaders did not decide on who would become the **President of the European Commission** nor did they decide on who would get the other top jobs. Discussions will resume on 30 June.

# What's happening in the EU?

Mercosur-EU deal update



18 June: Four leaders from France, Ireland, Poland and Belgium sent a letter to Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker on the <u>EU-Mercosur negotiations</u>. They stated that **no further offer of quotas** should be given to the Mercosur trade bloc for sensitive agricultural products such as **beef and ethanol**. Moreover, the coalition stressed that the EU should apply **certification and control** of imported quotas and comply with **sanitary**, **phytosanitary and environmental** standards.

The EU's Trade chief Cecilia Malmström admitted that **there are still big issues to solve**, notably on **agriculture**. "It is important to conclude, but not at any price of course", she stated. Commissioner Phil Hogan, however, declared that **"with the right circumstances" there will be an agreement** on the EU-Mercosur deal at the Ministerial at the end of next week (27-28 June).

#### Increased support for beekeeping



17 June: The Commission ring-fenced €120 million for the EU beekeeping sector for the next three years - an increase of €12 million compared to the period 2017-19.

<u>This EU financial support</u>, matched with national contributions, will apply to **national apiculture programmes** running from August 2019 to July 2022. The core measures will be education for beekeepers, support to start a beekeeping business, tackling parasites, research and schemes to improve the quality of honey.

• The European Commission is calling for submissions for its survey on precision farming: "<u>Does technology make agriculture in your region smarter?</u>" More information can be found <u>here</u>. The **deadline is 15 July**.

• **Two new consultations** have been published related to EU state aid: an <u>evaluation</u> of state aid instruments and a <u>review</u> of agricultural state aid guidelines. The **deadline for feedback is 19 July**.
